Project Aims and Objectives:

1. To empower the Low Income Group (LIG) and CSSA Recipients' self-management skill, self-confidence and inter-personal skills.
2. With the principle of 'Mutual Complement' 「凹凸互補」 to provide collaboration opportunity for Silver Power Intergeneration Volunteer Alliances (SPIVA) volunteer leaders and service recipients.
3. Through the mentors cooperation approach to organize Flying Butterfly Paradise Mutual Care Networking Volunteer Team to relief personal and family problem.
4. Organize community training school, after school care service and community volunteer service in response to the need of community, and encourage the LIG and CSSA recipients to develop their potential and make significant contribution to the need of community. Eliminate the labeling effect and to evocate the role change from service recipients to service providers.
5. Coordinate and invite district commercial sectors and different professionals as the volunteer leaders for the project. Provide opportunity for placement and to improve the career & economy.
6. Empower them to manage and implement Flying Butterfly Paradise Mutual Care Networking Project independently.

Unique Features of the Project:

1. Through the collaboration of different service sectors and professionals, provide Self-management Training Course as the starting point to enhance self-help and mutual help network among service recipients.
2. With the mentors matching approaching, establish Flying Butterfly Paradise Mutual Care Networking Volunteer Team to advocate self-esteem, competence and positive image.
3. The program will foster the harmony community and consolidate the intergeneration volunteer alliances to meet the social needs.

Expected Outcomes :**Phase One (Jan 2006 - July 2006)**

- Expected to implement 2 Volunteer Leaders Training Courses with 4 sessions and 8 participants per course. 16 participants will be well trained altogether.
- Expected to implement 3 Self-Management Programme Training Courses with 8 sessions and 15 participants per course. 45 LIG and CSSA recipients will be benefited.
- Through the course practicum of mutual care and concern visit, it is expected to have 45 LIG and CSSA families benefited.
- The course will assist participants to release their stress, build-up positive image, empower self-management, enhance healthy life style and improve inter-personal skills.
- Certificates will be issued to participants upon completion the course.
- With the principle of 'Mutual Complement' 「凹凸互補」 to encourage the combination of teacher-student to establish the Flying Butterfly Paradise Mutual Care Networking Volunteer Team. Expected to have 20 participants joining the project.

Phase Two (Aug 2006 – July 2007)

- Through the scheduled meeting and concern visit to enhance solidarity, mutual networking, respect of Senior Citizen and mutual support system among participants' families.
- Participants and their families will develop an optimistic philosophy and use their own strength to help others in needs. Eliminate the labeling effect and evocate the role change from service recipients to service providers.
- Encourage the combination of district commercial sectors and different professionals as partnership, in response to the need of community, to provide service and job opportunity.
- With the improvement of self-esteem and working skills, participants become the volunteer team leaders of community training school, after school care service and community volunteer service, serving the deprived group & families in need in the community. It is expected to have 200 beneficiaries in community.

Phase Three (Aug 2007-Jan 2009)

- With equip of relevant knowledge and skill, volunteer team is expected to implement community educational courses and volunteer mutual support service. It is expected to have 300 beneficiaries in community.
- It is expected to have more service recipients to join the Flying Butterfly Paradise Mutual Care Networking Volunteer Team and to recruit more members to organize community mutual care service.
- It is expected to increase more volunteer team members from Organizations, Schools and Business Sectors in the community. The intensive collaboration with the community organizations and companies will favour to provide practical training and job opportunities.
- Empower them to run Flying Butterfly Paradise Mutual Care Networking Project by themselves.
- After having the financing support from Community Investment and Inclusion Fund, the Flying Butterfly Paradise Mutual Care Networking Project will be operated in the self-financing basis and act as a social capital to serve and enrich our society.
