5. Ability to break down organizational barriers, mobilize community resources, secure ownership from partners, and build mutual help networks;
6. Maximize strength of local networks;
7. Responsiveness to local needs; and
8. Clear focus on social capital outcomes.

SPACE OF DREAM — Modern Mentoring Project

A number of the CLIF projects used the one-to-one personal mentors approach for young people who were generally disaffected with the formal school system and had quit school after form three or form five. It is a group at high risk of long-term unemployment, social disengagement and lacking in respect of social mobility. The focus of these in-depth and matched mentorship approaches aimed at motivating and reengaging these youth through the life experience of these mentors; and linking them to information, advice, resources and job opportunities that their families may not be able to provide.

One of these projects, "Space of Dream - Modern Mentoring Project", had successfully matched over 121 pairs of these mentorees relationships over a 21 months' period, with over half of these young people regaining motivation, confidence and life skills for further training or employment, and 46 young people had found jobs. The project had since been extended from NT North to Tai Po, Yuen Long, Tuen Mun and Tseung Kwan O.

Other projects that applied different elements of the mentorship approach involving disengaged youth included:

- Wheat Grass Charming Garden (TWGHs Lei Tung Integrated Services Centre); and
- Teens Networking Project (ELCHK Tin Shui Wai Integrated Youth Service Centre and Youth Outreaching Social Work Team).
