Project Summary:

This project adopts the “Community-Welfare-Business” cross-sectoral collaboration model. Using the promotion and practice of the concept of “Happy & Healthy” as intervention points, it strengthens the positive attitude of residents. The project encourages residents to participate in the community and expand their social networks to jointly build up a community with the spirit of mutual benefit and mutual support. The project will focus on supporting the adaptation of new residents of Sau Yun House to the new environment and promote the integration between the new and old residents in Sau Mau Ping Estate.

Programmes include:

1. **Establishment of a support network:** to use “Happy & Healthy” as the theme to engage the old residents (including the elderly, women and young people) of Sau Mau Ping Estate and Sau Mau Ping South Estate in different types of activities. “Resource kits” are produced and the new residents are guided to walk around the community, and this will help the new residents of Sau Yun House to adapt to the new environment and promote a mutual help and trust relationship between the new and old residents, thereby gradually establishing a social support network.
2. **Strengthening the neighbourhood support network:** to collaborate with stakeholders to provide training for volunteers who will visit the elderly in need in the estate on a regular basis, care for their daily needs, and provide appropriate community information or referral services, which will result in establishing a sustainable neighbourhood support network. At the same time, volunteers will identify elders with potentials during the visits and encourage them to participate in the neighbourhood support activities or become volunteers with a view to supporting other elders in need in the district, promoting a spirit of mutual help among neighbours and strengthening the community support network.
3. **Establishment of a cross-sectoral collaboration platform:** to connect stakeholders in the Community-Welfare-Business sectors with cross-sectoral collaborators to form a platform for sharing information and experience, and to initiate responsive actions related to the community needs through regular meetings or gatherings. The collaborators will also develop a referral system to support the residents’ needs.
