- \* October 2001: Chief Executive's Policy Address
- ★ February 2002: Funding approved
- \* February 2002: First public briefing held
- \* April 2002: CLLF Committee established
- \* August 2002: CITF Guide and Application Form launched; first batch applications invited
- ★ September 2002: 18 briefings sessions held for > 1000 participants from > 600 groups

### New Emphases 知明悟達通

- The "Haves" The "Have-nots"
   Social networking Human Relationships
   Non-material: intellectual, psychological, I EAS
- \* New Agency Roles third sector partnerships, different philosophical approaches to resource sharing (not a zero sum game)
- \* Management of high standards (including corporate governance)
- \* Sustainability of outcomes results are cumulative
- ★ Outcome evaluation

# "Demonstration" Projects 入選計劃的特徵

- \* 3 types of entry points:
  - Networks
  - Marginalised groups new modes, new perspectives (givers, not just receivers)
  - Innovative services
- Community network building strengthen relationships, anchored in the neighbourhood
- Incorporating a variety of services more effective responses to those in need
- Collaboration with other sectors: businesses, professions, groups
- Optimal utilization of existing facilities & resources: government, community, own agency

# Mobilizing the community - a few key statistics 發揮潛能

- \* 14 projects were selected
- \* 4 projects are combined for implementation
- \* Provide early models of collaboration : achieve greater synergy and better use of resources
- ★ A total of 14.5 paid staff will be involved for all 12 projects
- ★ Over 4000 volunteers will be mobilized: with a high % of ex-service users becoming volunteer contributors
- ★ Over 30 different types of mutual help, support and co-operative networks will be established
- ★ Over 15000 people will be involved
- \* Meaning? beginnings of multiple contact points

### Comments by Ms Sophia Kac Chairperson of the Assessment Sub-Committee 評審小組主席 高靜芝女士

- ★ Similar target groups across all projects the unemployed, single-parents, low-income, the aged, & cross generations etc
- **★** Building the foundation: focus on building networks and empowering those in need
- ★ Changing attitudes and values: emphasis on giving, sharing, exchanging, and matching of resources and skills - not just receiving
- ★ Bearers of unique strengths: each agency bringing its existing local networks, volunteers, facilities and people resources

## Comments by Ms Sophia Kad

- \* Synergy: combining grassroots connections with community leaders, professional expertise and business support
- \* Anchored in local communities: at neighbourhood, street-levels.
- Models of collaboration
- ★ Clear visions of the end results for their communities: more caring, more cohesion, and more sharing of resources.

Commentaries by Dr Joseph Kwok, 郭鍵勳博士 Chairman of the Evaluation and Development of Social Capital Sub-Committee

- **★** All involved working with different "marginalized" communities and groups homeless, people living in transient /interim housing; with ex-mental health problems, the aged and at risk youth.
- \* Most of them are hard to engage
- \* All the projects proposed very positive strategies: to engage, motivate, build up self-worth, develop capacities for self-help, mutual help and contribution back to society

### Commentaries by Dr Joseph Kwok

- \* All aims at changing:
- attitudes (from passive receivers to active givers),
- status (from clients to helpers) and
- relationships (from one directional to reciprocal)
   between these groups and their communities

Commentaries:

- \* Involving alternative service delivery approaches
- **★** Discovering the local and indigenous potentials within their respective communities
- ★ The "givers" and the "receivers": they both have needs (e.g. the unsupported young nursing mothers and the middle aged women who can offer post-natal care and support; students from the new arrival communities and elders etc)

### Commentaries: Prof. Angelina Yuen:阮曾媛琪教授

- \* Building capacity & resilience: the values, skills, potential, life experience of those with limited formal qualifications are recognized & extended
- \* Knitting and extending mutual support & collaboration: the service recipients will become the support base for their local communities: support networks will be further established through joint projects or initial service exchanges
- **★ life-long learning and development:** Training will be provided to enhance & empower their employment and contributory options, e.g. to provide peer counselling, community support, volunteer or paid roles.

- \* The purpose of this briefing: changing attitudes, furthering the shared learning process & extending networks
- \* Key points to note when revising proposals or submitting new ones
  - "break out of the frame" in interpreting social capita
  - be innovative in designing strategies to develop social capital
  - Make best use of your own potentials and resources
  - Get to know know your communities really well
  - but practical, making sure the plans will work
  - Be realistic with your budget
  - Demonstrate willingness and capacity to collaborate

- \* The Selected Projects will go live soon a formative & learning process

- \* Open to second batch proposals: 01/02/03 -30/04/03

- \* "Training sessions" on specific topics will be organized if necessary: e.g. on developing clear objectives; SMART outcome measures; budget planning etc
- \* Annual sharing forum sharing of good practices; building up experience; accumulating social capital-building experience within and across groups and communities
